To get started with selecting a well-vented model, look for one with large openings in its walls or ceiling--this will allow more air flow into and out of the sheltering area as needed without compromising privacy too much by allowing passersby access into its interior space via windows or doors (which might need locking anyway).

Consider Other Features of the Carport

When you're deciding whether or not to build a carport, it's important to consider all the features that will make your new outdoor structure functional and enjoyable. The following are some things to think about:

- **Lighting.** If you want your carport to be more than just a place for people to park their cars, consider installing lights so that it can be used as an extra space during parties or other events. You may also want to install security lights that shine onto the driveway so no one parks there without permission (or steals anything).
- **Security measures** like cameras and alarms can help protect valuables stored inside the garage if someone breaks into it while no one is home; however these systems come at an additional cost--and potentially require an extensive amount of wiring work on top of everything else!
