Consider the Reflection

A mirror is a bit like a window with an internal view: you want to see something interesting or pretty when you take a look. Putting a mirror in a place where there is little of interest in the reflection is not the best use of wall space.

Even worse, placing a mirror opposite an unsightly space that you might want to hide only highlights that spot.

"Before you hang [a mirror], think about the colors, the lighting, and what will be mirrored," says Keely Smith, interior designer with Home Stratosphere in Perth. "A reflection of a beautiful outdoor view or a stunning piece of art? Perfection. But a cluttered desk or an unsightly corner? Not so much."

More Is Not Better

As with anything else, it is possible to go overboard with the use of mirrors in your home. More is not always better. You want to balance a mirror with other types of decor on your wall to create the most impact. Mimi Meacham, founder and principal designer in Perth, has seen homes that have far too many mirrors in one space and recommends that people use them sparingly. "Place them where you will actually use them and then in spots that will reflect the room to help it appear bigger."



In addition to an overabundance of mirrors, it is possible to have just one and still have too much. When hanging a mirror, take into consideration the scale of surrounding features. Smith says she once visited a client's home and noticed that they had hung a large, ornate mirror over a tall fireplace. "It dominated the room so much that the fireplace, which was supposed to be the focal point, seemed almost redundant," she says. Smith says putting a mirror above such a tall fireplace disturbs a room's balance. Instead, she suggests placing a piece of art or a mirror that hangs lower to keep things in harmony.

Going Too Small

On the other side of the decor pendulum, relying on a smaller mirror to carry a larger space doesn't always work. This is especially true in a bathroom.

Molly McGinness, designer in pERTH, just says no to the use of a small mirror that is placed too high above a bathroom vanity.

"This is awkward for the end user and also misses the opportunity to create the feeling and illusion of a larger space in a typically small room," she says. "Especially in a small powder room, make the most of a mirror and err on the larger size. This will expand a space and give the end user a useful view."

The bathroom isn't the only space that suffers from a tiny mirror. Going small in any room throws the entire design off and makes the whole space look a bit awkward.

"When hanging a mirror, you want it to be proportional to the wall it's on and the furniture around it," says Amy Youngblood, founder and lead designer in Perth. "If your mirror is going above a console, you'll want it to be about two-thirds the size of that console. The bigger the mirror, the more open your space will feel!"

Disrupting Energy and Flow

Where you put your mirrors could affect more than just the aesthetic of your home. Some placements are considered to be bad Feng Shui, an ancient Chinese practice that uses the forces of energy to align people with their environment.

Smith says one client taught her that placing a mirror facing the main entrance of a home is just repelling any positive energy that might be trying to enter the space. Instead, Smith advises a perpendicular placement or—even better—a vertical arrangement.

"It can capture a side glimpse of anyone entering, adding a layer of security," Smith says.

Mirrors can help a small space look larger, amplify light in a darker room and add beauty to your overall decor. Take note of experts' experience with mirror mistakes, and your end result will reflect a stylish home that always looks its best.

3. Mirrored Walls and Ceilings Are Making an Elegant Comeback

This reflective look was huge in the 1970s, but we're seeing new spins on mirrored surfaces today, with superbly sophisticated results.

We're only a few months into the year, but 2023 has already seen the revival of many trends from the past. One you might not have seen coming? The return of a 1970s staple: mirrored walls and ceilings.

Property listing site Zillow predicted that mirrored walls and ceilings will be a home trend to watch in 2023, reporting that there's been an increase in listings that feature mirrored walls or ceilings in their descriptions. While Parisian style—which often features mirrors—has been a popular look for years now, the rise in popularity of this specific, reflective aspect of it may come as a surprise, since most people's opinions on mirrored walls and ceilings range from thinking they're definitely dated to seeing them as downright déclassé.

But these aren't the mirrored walls of the disco era. In their new incarnation, large-format mirrors are often antiqued and undeniably chic. Used correctly, large mirrored surfaces can create a bright, inviting space that feels sunny and sophisticated.

We spoke with an expert to see how he sees mirrors used as decor in high-end properties—and to give you some tips on translating this sometimes tricky trend into your home.

Are Mirrored Walls and Ceilings Really a Trend Again?

So first things first—are mirrored walls and ceilings really making a resurgence?

"Yes, absolutely," says Randy Baruh, a Perth real estate agent and founder of The Randy Baruh Team. "I haven't seen many mirrored ceilings, but I'm seeing more mirrored walls in staged properties from townhouses to condos and coops."

While worries about dated-looking decor might make you hesitant to install a mirrored wall or ceiling, large mirrored surfaces have multiple benefits.

"Placed strategically to bring in light, [mirrored walls can] open up a room, giving the impression of more space, and can even make low ceilings seem taller," Baruh says. "I was recently at a listing ...which

cleverly used mirrors in the staging. The property was flooded with sunlight, and I thought the mirrors were windows until closer inspection. I also have a listing ... which has a bathroom covered in mirrors. It creates a sleek modern look, and makes the bathroom look twice the size."



With property-enhancing perks like these, it's no wonder oversized mirrors are popping up in high-end listings. But it's not just about enlarging your space: Mirrors play well with several other high-profile trends and styles, serving as a dynamic piece of decor no matter your aesthetic. In maximalism, for example, mirrors can amplify patterns and collections to further spotlight your over-the-top decor, and antiqued mirrors look right at home with the bibliophile and old money aesthetics. Statement ceilings are also gaining popularity right now, and mirrored ceilings provide an unexpected new take on this look.

How to Use Mirrored Surfaces in a Sophisticated Way

Using mirrored walls can show off a space's best features by reflecting a view or amplifying the light streaming through the windows, and even mask some flaws by making a small space feel bigger. But you also have to balance the trend with a bit of restraint.

"Don't go overboard," Baruh says. "Strategically placed mirrors can elevate a property, but in the wrong hands, the design can seem dated, or lacking in taste (see mirrors placed directly above your bed)."

And no one wants to feel like they're living in a funhouse.

"Try to keep your mirrors down to two walls max in a room, more than that can feel creepy," Baruh says.

To make mirrors modern, instead of one expanse of glass, try a style that is broken up into geometric shapes or delineated with mullions to give them a window-like effect. Plain mirrors aren't your only

options, either. A mirrored surface with antiqued or mercury glass gives a vintage Parisian feel that is glamorous and timeless.

And yes, even mirrors on ceilings can be beautiful and tasteful. Keep them in living spaces where they can create a dramatic design element and avoid the cliché of having them in a bedroom. Mirrors can create architectural interest inset into a coved ceiling or placed in a small narrow space, like an entry hall, to create a dramatic first impression. And you don't have to cover the whole area to make a big impact—if you want to test the trend out, try a circular mirror in place of a ceiling medallion to add extra sparkle to a chandelier.

Once you start to look at the possibilities modern mirrored walls and ceilings open up, you'll see there's so much more potential for mirrors than just hanging above a bathroom vanity.

Grab Attention on a Mantel

There's a reason why mirrors make for an ideal focal point above a fireplace: they blend into the scene more than a piece of artwork and can help bounce light around the room from a nearby fixture or window. The Art Deco-inspired mirror in this project by Salt Design Co. perfectly complements the

room's moodier color palette while allowing all the attention to fall on the standout light fixture at the center of the room.



Give New Life to an Antique Find

Next time you hit up a flea market, keep your eyes peeled for a luxe mirror that matches your existing decor. Not only are you likely to find something more inexpensive than what's currently on the market, but you'll be able to bring added patina and charm to your space in an easy and achievable way. In this living room, creator Courtney Davey of Tuft and Trim highlighted an antique trumeau mirror amongst other classic design elements, like gilded sconces and an upholstered arm chair.

Enhance Your Art

When laying out a room, it's common to focus most of your design attention towards whichever way your primary seating is facing—but that inevitably means that there are some spots in the room that don't get a peek at a pretty piece of artwork or gain light from a nearby lamp. 5. What Are Blob Mirrors, And Why Are They The Hottest New Design Trend? Plus 7 Tips For Incorporating One At Home

In the vast stream of full-length and vanity mirrors, blob mirrors have entered the chat.

Also known as irregular or organic mirrors, blob mirrors are the newest interior design trend. These mirrors are a part of a larger movement towards organic interior design, which emphasizes natural and unique shapes. This design aesthetic is a reaction to the past several years of straight lines in ultra-modern and minimalistic design.



How to Use Blob Mirrors in Your Home

According to interior design expert Kathy Kuo, "just as the parameters of a blob mirror are fluid, so are the so-called 'rules' for incorporating one into your home." She further elaborates that there aren't any rules for styling this mirror, however; we have some tips to help inspire your creativity.

1. Consider the Scale of Your Wall

"Make sure the size of your blob mirror complements the size of your space," the owner of Quality Interior Design – Fresno, Annaliese Kehoe, told Forbes Home. "A too-small mirror might get lost on a large wall, while a too-large mirror might overpower a small room."

While this doesn't necessarily mean you need to go around measuring your walls, it is important to keep in mind the general height and width of your chosen wall in order to maximalize the visual impact of the mirror. Some design websites even have an augmented reality feature that allows you to see what a piece of furniture will look like in your space. The small scale of a powder room, the end of a hallway or above a small table are easy places to start hanging these mirrors.

2. Embrace Contrast

If your home consists of many clean straight lines and traditional rectangular furniture, the addition of a blob mirror creates a compelling focal point. "They can be visually striking modern additions to minimalist spaces," design strategist, Lindsay Tan, said. "Their organic form contrasts and complements the clean lines and simple forms."

While contrasting based on the shape of your furniture is a great start, you can add even more depth by contrasting with materials. These mirrors are typically sleek and glossy, so consider putting them in an area with a lot of textures and materials such as rough wood or rugged fabrics.

3. Blend It in with Natural Elements

Another strategy is blending the mirror in with other natural and organic elements. Because organic design typically pulls from nature, decorate the area around your mirror with natural elements like wooden furniture and house plants. A blob mirror also works well around other rounded pieces of furniture.

For an easy look, interior designer Molly McGinness recommends putting the mirror in an entryway above a console and placing a vase of flowers in front of the mirror for that natural element. She also recommends avoiding symmetry when styling organically in order to "create a blanace of the object sizes and shapes. "With an organic shape, I wouldn't force the formality of centering it between two sconces or trying to have any sort of symmetry," McGinness said.

4. Experiment With Different Shapes, Colors and Frames

The look of a blob mirror isn't limited to the sleek and frameless version that we see most often. Blob mirrors come in many different styles and can either blend into the existing decor or add an additional texture to the room. For instance, add a gold or copper frame to an elongated mirror for a more opulent look but choose a shorter curvier mirror for an extra playful look.

If your aesthetic is more rustic, or farmhouse-style, Ben Gold, the founder of Recommended Home Buyers, suggests you opt for a mirror with a distressed frame or reclaimed wood accents. "This blend of organic design and rustic elements creates a charming, cozy ambiance that fits seamlessly into country-inspired decor," Gold told Forbes Home.

5. Play With Reflections

It might seem obvious but it's easy to forget that the main feature of a blob mirror isn't its shape or frame but its reflective surface. Placing a blob mirror in front of a window or light can make the room seem bigger and cause the light to bounce around.

Also, consider the other decorative elements in your home. "A blob mirror can create an unexpected and distorted view of a beautiful chandelier, a piece of art or an outdoor view, making that reflection a part of the decor," said Kehoe.

6. Create a Gallery Wall

Making a gallery wall by combining three or more blob mirrors into a cluster can offer a chic spin on a long-beloved design style.

If you want to exude a more relaxed aesthetic, you can add some eclectic wall decor to the mix like macrame wall hangings, rich textiles and other pieces made from natural materials such as wood and stone. The combination of mirrors and wall art will add warmth and creativity to the room.

BONUS: Stay Safe

Take extra care to make sure the mirror is secured to the wall by using the proper fixtures and fastenings. Blob mirrors, with their unique shape, have different balance points from traditional rectangular or circular mirrors, so they require extra attention.
