

SEASONING AND STORAGE TIPS

For Firewood In Perth

1

Choose the Right Location

Select a dry and well-ventilated area for stacking firewood. Avoid areas with excessive humidity or direct sunlight, as these can affect the seasoning process and cause wood to crack.

2

Stack Off the Ground

Place firewood on a raised platform, such as pallets or bricks, to keep it off the damp soil. This helps prevent moisture absorption from the ground, which can hinder the drying process and promote mold growth.

3

Cover Stacks with Ventilation

Cover the top of the firewood stack with a tarp or roof to protect it from rain and direct sunlight. Ensure the sides of the stack remain open to allow for adequate airflow, which aids in drying while shielding from precipitation.

4

Utilize Seasoning Sheds

Consider using a dedicated seasoning shed or covered area with open sides for stacking firewood. This provides protection from rain and excessive sun exposure while allowing natural ventilation to facilitate drying.

5

Rotate Stock Regularly

Implement a rotation system where older, well-seasoned firewood is used first. This ensures a consistent supply of dry firewood for burning, particularly important during the cooler winter months when efficient burning is crucial.
