
Kitchen Furniture


What should I look for when buying furniture?

III. How to Clean Wood Furniture to Make It Look New Again



When it comes to wood furniture maintenance, there are a number of terms that get tossed around, such as dusting, cleaning, waxing, and polishing. While experts have varying opinions on wood furniture care, the technique you use will depend on the finish.

How to Clean Wood Furniture

When cleaning wood furnishings, never use all-purpose cleaning sprays, such as the kind used on kitchen tables, unless your furniture has a plastic coating. If you've used wood sprays and polishes in the past or suspect that furniture has been polished with them, be aware that these residues can interfere with refinishing and may need professional attention.

Step 1: Prepare the Cleaner

To revive grimy wood furniture, mix equal parts olive oil, denatured alcohol, gum turpentine, and strained lemon juice.

Step 2: Apply and Buff

Apply with a soft cloth and buff with a clean cloth.

Step 3: Remove Sticky Spots

Sticky spots may need to be treated with soap and water. To do this, dip a lint-free cloth in mild soap or detergent dissolved in water, wring the cloth nearly dry, and wipe the area. Rinse and immediately dry with a clean, soft cloth.

How to Apply Furniture Paste Wax

Typically during manufacture, varnish, polyurethane, or shellac is applied to wood to protect the surface. Applying wax or polish protects the manufacturer's finish and helps to reduce surface scratches. Wax provides a hard finish and long-lasting protection, doesn't smear, and is more durable than sprays or polishes.



Wax needs to be applied to furniture correctly, or it can cause streaks and a cloudy appearance. To properly apply furniture wax (\$7, The Home Depot) to restore shine in your wood furnishings, remember to always apply wax in light coats, rubbing into the surface with the grain.

Step 1: Prepare Wax

Put a spoonful of wood furniture wax, about the size of a golf ball, in a square of 100% cotton fabric. Wrap the fabric around the wax ball and knead it until soft.

Step 2: Wax and Wipe

Rub the wax-saturated fabric on the surface of the furniture, one small area at a time, until the surface dulls. Wipe off the excess wax with a clean, soft cotton cloth. Repeat waxing and wiping until the entire piece of wood furniture is waxed. If you notice a streak, keep wiping to remove excess wax.

Step 3: Polish and Buff


Polish wood furniture with a soft cloth or lamb's-wool pad attached to an electric drill or power buffer. If the wax smears, wipe with a soft cloth and continue buffing.

Step 4: Repeat and Maintain

For a deep shine, apply a second coat of wax in the same manner. To maintain waxed furniture, dust with a lamb's-wool duster. Never use liquid or aerosol furniture polishes because they can dissolve the wax and leave a hazy film.

How to Clean Old Wood Furniture

If you have an older piece of fine wood furniture or a delicate family heirloom, you'll likely want to treat it a little more carefully. This three-step cleaning and care routine is the best way to clean old wood furniture over time.



Step 1: Clean Every Year

Clean furniture approximately every year with oil soap diluted according to product label instructions. Apply with a clean cotton cloth and work with the grain per the product directions.

Step 2: Restore and Restain

Restore as needed, especially from sun fading, using a commercial finish restoring product (\$24, Walmart). Choose a shade closest to the wood stain you're working with and apply with #0000 steel wool (\$5, Walmart) to a small section at a time. Work with the grain of the wood and use light to moderate pressure. Immediately wipe clean with a lint-free cloth or cheesecloth.

Step 3: Condition Monthly

Use an orange oil or wax-based conditioner (\$10, The Home Depot) monthly to prevent drying and cracking.

How to Deep-Clean Wood Furniture

Step 1: Remove Grime and Dirt

As a first step to removing layers of grime from old wood furniture, use an oil soap (Murphy Oil Soap Wood Cleaner, \$4, Target) and water. Rinse and dry well. If the finish still seems dirty, clean lightly with #0000 steel wool dipped in a cleaning product.

Step 2: Wax Furniture

Apply clear paste wax following the steps outlined above.

How to Repair Surface Scratches on Wood Furniture

Scratching is almost inevitable with wood furniture. Here's how to remove scratches from wood furniture.

Step 1: Wax Surface

If the top of your piece is slightly scratched, apply paste wax or use a felt-tip touchup pen to fill in.

Step 2: Treat Deep Scratches

To fill deep scratches, use wood filler or a colored filler wax stick available at hardware and home improvement stores. Match the filler as closely as possible to the color of your piece and apply in several thin layers rather than in one thick layer.

Wood Furniture Care Tips

Even the highest-quality wood furnishings can be susceptible to odors and kinks. Luckily, there are a few easy ways to care for your wood furniture.

- If a vintage piece has a lingering smell, air it outside on a warm, dry day.
 Shade from direct sunlight.
- Pour talcum powder or baking soda over the surface to absorb odors.
- Place a shallow pan of charcoal briquettes inside drawers.

1. What's Wood Polishing?


Wood polishing is the simple process of polishing wood, as the name suggests. Now, there are different ways to polish wood. Wood polishing is done to ensure the shine stays on, the wood furniture pieces stand the test of time and look aesthetically beautiful.

2. How Do You Polish Wood?

You can polish wood by applying the wood polishing liquid with a soft piece of cloth. Now, the process of polishing wood is different for bare wood and finished wood.

There are different products and methods to approach the two. Wood polishing can become a tedious task that requires the intervention of professionals. You wouldn't be entirely wrong to opt for a professional, unless you want to DIY it at home.

3. How to Apply Wood Polish?



Applying wood polish is easy for certain categories of wood. You can just apply the wood polish with a soft piece of cloth or microfiber.

Wood furniture polish is sometimes followed by rubbing the wood with a wet cloth; and then rubbing off the excess with a dry cloth. That's because you wouldn't want dust to stick on the polish and give your wooden furniture a rough look.

Approach each section one by one to ensure you're covering all fronts, while polishing wood. However, as mentioned above, wood polishing requirements vary depending on the type of wood it is – bare or finished, and the type of furniture, installation or wall in question.

4. Types of Wood Polishing



Wood polishes are of many types. We can categorise them into two broad categories. The first is surface polish, where the polish stays on the surface and provides a thick layer of protection. While the second is penetrating polish, which penetrates the wooden surface and is absorbed inside.

Below, we've discussed some of them to give you a fair idea about what's what and help you choose the best wood polish for you:

i. Water-Based Wood Polish

Suitable to be used for all types of wood – stained, painted or bare, water-based wood polish gives your wooden items a clear coat of polish. Unlike oil-based polishes, it ensures that your wooden pieces don't become yellow in the long-run.

ii. Lacquer Wood Polish



One of the best wood polishes, preferred for the glossy shine it brings on, lacquer wood polish is perfect for giving your wooden pieces a rich and luxurious look.

The method of application is simple: spray it on the piece of wood and watch it dry up in minutes. However, as the finish might emit fumes, it's not a great idea to use it in a closed environment with children around. We suggest airing out your interiors, or doing this in the open.

iii. Varnish Wood Polish

Useful for bare and stained wooden items, varnish wood polish is available in many sheens, but can only be applied to wet areas.

iv. Shellac Wood Polish

Available in many wood polishing colours, shellac wood polish is known for its durability and hard finish. It's often used as a stain remover and sealer.

v. PU Wood Polish



Considered the best wood polish as it's perfect for all wooden surfaces and items, PU wood polish really takes the trophy with its hard finish, durability and sturdiness.

It's also resistant to moisture. While that's a big plus, it's not really made for the outdoors as it doesn't do very well under UV rays.

vi. Oil-Based Wood Polish

Oil-based wood polishes have a bad name in the market for giving your wooden surfaces a yellowish tinge. But, it's also quite popular. Wondering why?

That's because it's one of the most natural wood polishes, known for its luxurious shine and satin finish. It also does quite a good job of covering scratches and cuts on the wooden surfaces. It's one of the penetrating wood polishes. That's to say, it penetrates the surface and gets absorbed inside.


vii. Wax-Based Wood Polish

Another penetrating natural wood polish, wax-based wood polishes can be procured as a liquid a well as a paste. Wax-based polishes are mainly plant-based. In certain cases, they can be derived from animals as well.

viii. Melamine Wood Polish

A closed pore polishes, meaning, it makes the wood non-breathable and hence protected from cold and hot surfaces placed above it, melamine wood polish is great for usage in kitchens.



Next, apply a thin layer of olive oil using a clean rag. Ensure any excess oil has been rubbed off and repeat as required to confirm that the wood is protected, moisturised, and shiny. It is worth noting that if your wood furniture is coated or painted with a thick sealant is unlikely to effectively absorb the olive oil. There is also the option of using a mixture of white vinegar and olive oil.

- Mix equal parts of both these ingredients in a bowl.
- Dip a soft cloth in this cleaner and squeeze out the excessive liquid.
- Rub the cloth onto your furniture and do so by following the direction of the grain.
- Use a clean and dry cloth to buff the surface and get rid of remnants.

2. Shine Stainless Steel

A lot of the time, stainless steel might become a little dull, and you might not want to use toxic cleaning agents, fearing that they might damage the steel or negatively impact its appearance.



Moreover, professionals who do budget end of lease cleaning Sydney recommend refraining from being too aggressive with scrubbing if you would like to reduce the chances of scratches o the stainless steel fixtures. This is where using just a little bit of olive oil will be great.

Using too much is not recommended, and if there is excess, you will need to buff the surface to ensure there is no residue. Here is the procedure to follow:

- Moist a soft cloth with a little bit of olive oil.
- Use a circular motion to rub the cloth onto the surface.
- Keep buffing till the surface shines.
- Wipe away the excess oil with a clean and dry cloth.

3. Safeguard Your Garden Tools

Simply apply a tiny amount of oil onto a cloth and use a circular motion to rub it into the leather. It is best recommended to test it on an unnoticed area first and use a soft, clean cloth to buff the excess olive oil. "The sun can cause your furniture to fade, crack or warp over time," says Bryan Clayton, Founder of GreenPal, an online platform that connects homeowners with lawn maintenance pros in their area. "To prevent this, you should cover your furniture with a UV-resistant fabric or a tarp when not in use."

2. Clean Your Furniture Regularly

It's not pleasant to eat a meal at a dirty patio table or lay out on a lounge chair that's been the recipient of "presents" from birds flying overhead. Aside from the ick factor, cleaning your outdoor furniture ensures it lasts longer.



"Generally, you should wipe down your furniture with a damp cloth or a mild soap solution at least once a month to remove dust, dirt, pollen or stains," says Clayton. "You can also use a soft brush or a vacuum to remove any debris from the crevices or cushions."

3. But Make Sure to Use the Right Cleaning Products

Clean outdoor furniture is the goal, but don't just grab any product and start scrubbing.

To avoid mishaps for your furniture, read cleaning product labels carefully before using, then clean a test spot on a hidden part of a chair or table first to see if there's any discoloration or other damage.


4. Wipe Up Food and Drink Spills Quickly

If you're enjoying drinks or a meal al fresco, don't leave any food or beverages behind. "Food and drinks can attract pests and lead to stains," says Kropovinsky. Lindsay Schleis, VP of Business Development at POLYWOOD, a furniture company, recommends simply tipping cushions on their side to drain away water—and being more diligent about putting them away for next time.

Soggy cushions are nothing compared to what could happen to your furniture when the weather really kicks up.
