




UNEXPECTED THINGS YOU CAN DO ON THE GOLD COAST

Aside from the ample surf, dining destinations, and shopping opportunities scattered among this beach-heavy stretch in South-East Queensland, you'll find plenty of ways to spend your time that we can bet will take you by surprise. Here lie 13 unexpected things you can do on the Gold Coast, for those craving a little quirk.

1. Walk the alpacas at Canungra Valley Vineyards

Sure a trip to a vineyard is nothing out of the ordinary, but throw in a population of alpacas and you have one of the best unexpected things you can do on the Gold Coast. O'Reilly's Canungra Valley Vineyards in Lamington National Park welcomes you to walk their resident population around the lush creekside property.

2. Gaze at Gloworms

Get a good look at Australia's largest population of glow worms in Springbrook National Park. Sitting at the back of the Gold Coast, this hinterland destination is home to the Natural Bridge, which you can trawl at night as a part of a guided tour of its resident colony of protected glow worms and microbats.

3. Make your own gin

If you're a self-confessed fan of spirits why not dabble in the creation process and embrace the chance to make your own gin. One of the most unexpected things to do on the Gold Coast is one of the best for tipple fanatics - drop by Granddad Jacks Craft Distillery or Wildflower Gin to take part in a course which will show you the way.

4. Chase waterfalls

Within arm's reach of the Gold Coast is Cougal Cascades, picturesque waterfalls sitting just 20 minutes inland from Currumbin Valley. Stretch your legs along the easy rainforest walk (just 1.6 kilometres) before you cool off at the pool of water at the base of the cascades.

5. Drop by HOTA

No matter the time of year you visit, you'll be sure to find something happening at HOTA (or home of the arts). This more recent addition to Surfers Paradise really ups the ante in terms of culture for the community with its rotating art exhibitions, dance, comedy, music performances, and in-house cinema.

6. Immerse yourself in ancient history

It's at the Jellurgal Aboriginal Centre in Burleigh Heads that you'll have a chance to go deeper into the national park, as well as go deeper into Australian history. Take a guided tour around the region where you'll have a chance to educate yourself more about local first nations people, and the sacred sites nearby.

7. Snorkel off an artificial reef

Grab your flippers and make way to The Spit, where you'll find the Gold Coast's most recent tourist attraction. The Wonder Reef opened in early 2022, an artificial

reef designed to cater to the growing population of divers (of all levels) visiting these parts. Once the reef structures are established, more than 32,000m3 of new reef habitats will be created and local marine life is expected to descend.

8. Soar along the longest zipline in Australia

Adrenaline junkies will want to make a beeline for the Thunderbird Park Treetop Challenge and the Canyon Flyer in the Gold Coast Hinterland. The high ropes course is one of the region's most popular adventure attractions with 100 adrenalin-pumping tree top challenges, neighbouring the Canyon Flyer, a guided zip line tour which is Australia's largest, highest and fastest.

9. Pay a visit to one of the Gold Coast's Hidden bars

It's no secret that the Gold Coast has a burgeoning food scene, but it's also worth paying attention to the drinking options. Pay a visit to one of the Gold Coast's many secret bars for a seriously unforgettable tipple. Burleigh's Lockwood Bar opens only after dark with access via text message. Nearby there's also the warehouse-style Hidden Cherub, or Palm Beach's The Scottish Prince.

10. Kayak to an Island

Join the crew at Australian Kayaking Adventures for a day's cruise to one of the Gold Coast's neighbouring islands. Take the half day tour to nearby Stradbroke, or paddle below the skyscrapers at dusk as a part of the Sunset Kayak Adventure.

11. Wander to a beach gallery

The Swell Sculpture Festival is an annual attraction that tempts thousands to visit the Gold Coast, and for good reason. The unforgettable arts event sees Currumbin Beach transformed into a sandy gallery, where just under 100 local and international artists congregate to showcase their sculptures with plenty of interactive activities also on the itinerary.
