Two Main Types of Visitor Visas

1. Single Entry Visa

- **Purpose:** This visa allows you to enter Canada only once.
- **Duration:** After you leave Canada, the visa becomes invalid, even if it hasn't expired. Then, to visit Canada again, you'll need to submit a fresh application for a new visitor visa.
- **When is it given?** This visa type is typically granted in specific cases, including:
 - You're visiting Canada for a one-time event.
 - You're part of a limited exchange or program.
 - You're travelling from a country with certain restrictions.

2. Multiple Entry Visa

- **Purpose:** This visa allows you to enter and exit Canada multiple times within its validity.

Note: In most cases, Canada now issues multiple-entry visas by default unless there's a specific reason for a single-entry visa.

The Super Visa is for parents and grandparents who want to spend extended time with their family in Canada. This visa permits stays of up to 5 years per visit and allows multiple entries for up to 10 years, making it ideal for long-term family visits without the need to frequently reapply. Here's what you need to know:

Super Visa Eligibility Requirements

To qualify for a Super Visa, you must meet these conditions:

- **Family Relationship:** You must be the parent or grandparent of either:
 - A Canadian citizen
 - A [permanent resident of Canada](#)
 - A person registered under Canada's Indian Act
- **Sponsor Requirements:** Your child or grandchild in Canada must:
 - Be legally adult (18+ years old)
 - Currently resides in Canada.
 - Provide documentation proving their status (citizenship, PR, or Indian Status).
 - Demonstrate sufficient income (meeting LICO thresholds).
 - Submit a formal invitation letter committing to:
 - Financial responsibility for your visit.
 - Support throughout your stay.





- **Medical Requirements:**

- You must take an immigration medical exam.
- You must have valid medical insurance from a [Canadian insurance company](#) or an IRCC-approved foreign provider. The insurance must:
 - Have a validity period that covers 12 months, beginning when you enter Canada.
 - Your insurance must guarantee a coverage of at least CAD \$100,000 or unforeseen medical incidents. The coverage must begin from your actual date of entry into Canada, not from the date of application submission.
 - Be fully paid in advance or paid in installments with a deposit. Insurance quotes are not accepted.

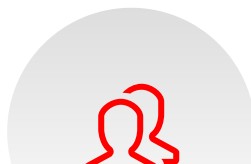
- **Additional Requirements:**

- To obtain a new Super Visa, you need to complete the application process through a visa office located outside Canadian borders.
- Immigration officials must be convinced you have genuine intentions to leave Canada before your tourist visa expires.

Note: You'll receive your visa from one of Canada's international visa offices located in your home country or region.
